YORKSHIRE THREE PEAKS

Camping for this weekend is to be in the field at the rear of the Crown Hotel, Horton-in-Ribblesdale. (O.S. Map No. 90-Ref. the Golden Lion Hotel is at the opposite end of the village to closed.

Suggested route is via the Ml, A65 to Settle and B6479 to Horton. The intention is to walk the Three Peaks on the Saturday. This is due to the annual Fell Race taking place on the Sunday. (Any fit Oread feel like trying to beat the current record of appx. 2 hours 42 mins?)

Apart from the Three Peaks the local area provides plenty of alternatives. Climbing on three local crags i.e. Twistleton Scars, Crummackdale and Langcliffe Quarry or with a not too lengthy drive all areas listed in the Yorkshire Limestone Guide Book are within easy reach. Visits can also be made to local caves i.e. Skirwith and White Scar or a leisurely potter can be made from Ingleton to visit the local waterfalls.

Although the field is used for camping there may not be any running water so please bring your own.

Travellers from Ilkeston or Spondon can alternatively take the Dale Road and turn down Moor Lane to Ockbrook, where The Royal Oak is on the right.
