

Craig Cowarch yields climbs of all standards with routes upto 500 ft. long and good routes are to be found on other crags in the area.

The Arrans (highest point Aran Fawddy 2,970') provide enjoyable walking and Cader Idris is within reach (just!) and you'll be ready for the Knacker's yard at the end of the day.

Boozing is to be had in the village of Dinas Mawddwy (Red Lion) a good pint and a good landlord with a singing room in the back if you want it.

COMBINED LAKELAND WALK AND CRAG LOUGH MEET



So names, please, to Derrick Burgess as soon as possible. TO ALL HUT USERS


It has been pointed out recently, that the rule banning dogs from the huts has been forgotten/overlooked by some members and friends.

Roger Kingshott, 4 Park Avenue, Keyworth, was made a member at the last committee meeting.


CHANGES OF ADDRESS
