MAY 18/20 CWM EIGIAU

Cwm Eigiau can claim, along with the C.I.C. hut and Cwm Cowarch, to be 'the nearest thing to an Alpine hut in Britain'. Wildly situated in the Carneddau near to the great crags of Craig Ys Ysfa and Ysgolion Duan, which offer such wonders as a 1000 ft V. Diff (with panoramic views), Great Gully (S. for strong swimmers etc) and for thw walkers a chance of, once again, not finding the summit of Carnedd Llewellyn in the mist.

Situation G.R. 714 638 on O.S. sheet 107

Approach Head generally in the direction of Wales. At Pentrefoelas turn right signpost Nebo (B 5113) through Nebo to Llanrwst. Turn left in Llanrwst over packhorse bridge through Trefiw, Dolgarroy to Talybont. Turn left in Talybont, hairpins upwards and continue to fork. Either Left 2½ miles to dam, leave a shorter walk to hut (15 min) but rough. Safari drivers only. OR Right, go until you stop, then follow track down on foot. A track leads from the dam to the hut. Torch necessary.

The hut holds 12 moderate sized people only when fully cooperating. Camping is possible below the dam or higher if you carry gear. For bookings and lifts see me in the Wilnot

I first visited this limestone crag a few years ago and was greatly impressed with the selection of routes of all standards which it has to offer plus the pleasant outlook onto High Wheeldon. For those who do not want to climb there are plenty of sunbathing spots and an excellent walk can be had over Chrome and Parkhouse hills, which afford fine views towards Axe Edge and the Dane Valley.

Approach is via the Ashbourne-Buxton Road, leave the main road for Earl Sterndale, upon entering the village turn sharp left for Crowdsote. The crag is situated in a valley about ¾ mile from the village.
