Camping for this meet, is on a small undulating site on the left hand side of the road, to Symonds Yat Rock, from Goodrich (North) B. 4229 and from Coleford (South) B. 4432. The turn into the site is steep and a small chapel guards the entrance. Ref; 563 162 HEREFORD 142 O.S. It can be seen easily from Yat Rock at the foot of the steep final incline 50 yards to the Morth. The site is popular with canoe-ists or Ernie Phillips' "Tod-Puddle-Paddlers" so it is adviseable to spread cars around to reserve space. The climbing is good limestone. For Symonds Yat area there is a guide, but good obvious routes abound. 'Wyndeliffe' on the Monmouth Chepstow Road just after Tintern Abbey is good, and a cheap guide can be obtained written by Frank Cannings. Wintours Leap is also a fine crag in the Coleford-Chepstow Road area with many classic routes 300-4001t in length from V. Diff 'to Hard V.S. "Bottle Battress to King Kong" I will be in the pub in Goodrich on Friday evening to welcome all. comers. WELSH WALK

If I can find some transport that's working it may be a chance to see me on the hills -but not alone, I hope. A traverse of part of the Black Mountains is the venue. This is a chance to see some of the grandest of South Wales, infrequently visited by the Oread. A suggested best route to the Friday night camp site, which is at Capel-y-ffin (Capel Farm J. Loyd) Map Ref; 255 316 O.S. sheet 141, is A38 to M6-M5-M50 Ross on Wye along the A49 to St. Owen's Cross Proceeding along the B.4251 to Cross Ash then N.W. to Llanwihangel and the B4423 track to Capel-y-ffin.

Saturday - traverse the eastern sector of the Black Mountains from the summit of Tal-y-cefn (2303) to Pen Cerrig-calch (2301) and decending to Crickhowell for liquid refreshment and the campsite

at Gilfach Farm (m/r 204 192)

Stinday - Proceed by quickest possible transport or on foot West along the B4558 and thenvia the Duffryn Craenon track to the old Talabont railway line to the Blaen-y-glyn waterfalls (m/r 061 174). Then traverse the high ground to the Beacon Summit Pen-y-Van (2907) and Corn Du (2863) Finish up either on foot or the nearest transport pick up point towards Brecon. The logistics of transporting drivers and equipment will have to be sorted out on the spot and of course at the Wilmot Arms. Please contact me nearer the date.

From here the best climbing is probably on Crag Lough (G.R. 765 679, quartz dolerite, 88routes, 60-100ft all grades)

and Great Wanney Crag (G.R. 935 835, fell sandstone, 30routes, mainly V.diff/severe 40ft)

The area abounds with walks crossing moorland, forests and rivers. The Pennine Way crosses Hadrians Wall near Crag Lough heading towards the Cheviots 20 miles to the north. The wall itself
