Saturday was cloudy but bright with the sun occasionally breaking through and we caught a glimpse of the eclipse in the afternoon. Tim and Dave, together with Pete Holden & Ollie Howard did some of the harder lines including the classic Tudor Rose. Tim straved onto an nearby E5. Most of us climbed the more moderate, but really enjoyable lines on the cliff while Jack & Janet roamed along the cliff path taking in the bracing sea air. This went to Jack's head so we all benefited when he bought a round for everyone in the evening to celebrate having become an official pensioner.

Sunday brought clear blue skies, but with strong southerly winds accompanied by a high tide, the seas were crashing into the cliffs in a most spectacular way, which made many of the climbs inaccessible. However Dancing Ledges were clear and most went here to sample the modern sport routes. Pete and Ollie, together with myself and local activist Pete Finclaire, were able to access several routes in the Marmolata Buttress area on the Boulder Ruckle. We were joined later by Gwen Tresidder and Jamie Fisher from Oxford. My life literally hung on a thread when I abseiled with my krab inadvertently attached to a gear loop instead of the harness loop. However, having survived this error, we did some excellent climbs including the Adventures of Portland Bill. This traversed about 60 ft up the cliff, with the seas almost reaching the line giving a most spectacular and exhilarating climb.

BRAIN TEASER

Last Month's Problem

Weight of block 300kg (easy) The only external forces on the block are gravity through its centroid, and the tension in the rope., so taking moments about the front edge, stabilising moment from gravity = 300kg by 250 mm, or 75 kg m. Therefore maximum rope tension allowable = 75kg m. divided by rope eccentricity of 200mm or 0.2 m. ie 75/0.2 or 375 kg. The other forces mentioned ,such as rope friction, were red herrings because they are internal, ie equal and opposite. Digger fell into the trap this time, no one else replied.
